## Message from the Executive Director



Dear Retired Players,

I'm pleased to announce that our Board of Directors have approved major enhancements to the PFRPA Dental Plan. As of June 1, the annual maximum increased to \$3,000 for each of our members. Also, retired NFL players are now able to add their lawful spouse to share their dental plan coverage, just by completing a simple form. Furthermore, all retired players enrolled in the Dental Plan now have the same coverage, regardless of total credited NFL seasons earned. In less than one month since implementing these enhancements, we have already received forms from more than 1,000 retired players wishing to share their plan coverage with their spouses. You can help these numbers continue to grow by spreading the word about the Dental Plan to your former teammates and fellow retired players.

We trust that these significant enhancements illustrate our dedication to creating meaningful benefits for the health and welfare of all retired NFL players. In fact, our Board of Directors recently met to discuss future programs and benefits to provide for our members. Following the meeting, PFRPA hosted a reception at the US Capitol to bring focus to those suffering from traumatic brain injuries, with attention on our military veterans. ## Summary of PFRPA Dental Plan Enhancements



**Effective June 1, 2018, the following enhancements were made to your benefit:**

- ❖ Annual maximum increased to **\$3,000**.
- ❖ You can now add your **lawful spouse** to your dental plan coverage and share the \$3,000 annual maximum.
- ❖ All enrolled retired players now have the same annual maximum.

- ❖ Your current ID card is still valid, so you **do not** need a new ID card.
